Phil, our treasurer, will have a great power point presentation at our next meeting, March 7. We all look forward to these, as it paints a vivid picture of the issues. Our club is famous for its auction and we appreciate the hard work from the many members who make it happen.

We continue to explore options to assist teachers and students with opportunities in wireless technologies. We now provide multimeters to young people passing their license examinations. We are looking at the Wouxun single band handheld UHF transceivers, priced at under \$100. They can be programmed to a total of 16 channels for use by students in a club, and through specific repeaters. For example, the Pueblo HS ARC has a 440 repeater on Mt Lemmon, and radios programmed to that repeater would provide a kid friendly environment. I would like to see six of these kids in

the club who have passed their tests receive these radios, and report back to us how they are using them, and provide to us a video to present to PTAs and other groups in the West Valley. No other method is more powerful than kids helping kids. I will be asking for your vote to make this happen.

We have several feelers out for possible options for a club radio shack. Some feel that 111th Ave on the Youngtown side might work. With our 501c3 tax exempt status, there may exist possible donors. If you don't have your antenna up, you may not get the signal. I need ideas from you. Would you use a club station if we had one? Would you mentor area kids to show them the excitement of ham radio? Would you be interested in operating a club station during Field Day and Special Events?

Next it was phone calls to last years volunteers to see if they could work again.

To our dismay, they had changed the doors to the room and the locks were different and wouldn't open. The church people said no one can open the door but Father John and he isn't here.

After 'awhile' Father John did show up and gave us a new key. Once the doors were opened the second ugly surprise happened, no one had set up the tables and chairs for the auction like I had discussed with them 2 weeks before. Meanwhile early volunteers were showing up so we got to work arranging the tables and chairs ourselves.

After awhile a church worker showed up and finished the job while explaining "I forgot!". Finally around 5 PM the tables were set up and covered with paper, volunteers were getting their assigned areas ready and early birds started showing up with items to sell. A good crowd showed up by 7PM when the auction started and shortly after 10PM it was over except for the Cashier crew headed by Phil W1PW. The money was all collected, receipts made out, and proud new owners of things like a 1927 Atwater Kent radio and a Collins 30L1 amplifier were heading home.

Two days later as I am writing this, Phil and his crew has finalized the numbers and **the total Auction Sales by the club was \$3529**. Phil is going to make a Power Point presentation **of the auction details**, and will present it at the next club meeting which will be Monday eve. March 7th. The work was done by 16 volunteers who spent approximately 147 hours to make this auction happen.
